REQUIREMENTS FOR Certification as:

REGIONAL PDI JUDGE

- 1. Applicant must be a regular or associate member of the USPCA.
- 2. Applicant must have a minimum of three (3) years experience as a police K-9 handler. Applicant must have handled or trained a police service dog that has obtained a PDI certification in a recorded sanctioned USPCA certification trial.
- 3. Applicant must have judged a minimum of three (3) regional certifications in not less than a 2-year period, covering all phases of obedience, article search, box search and criminal apprehension. (Criminal Apprehension includes with and without gunfire)
- 4. A total of not less than forty-five (45) K9 teams must be judged over this period in each phase.
- 5. The Regional Executive board will provide a letter showing approval of the applicant wishing to become a certified judge. The application will be submitted on-line at www.uspcak9.com and must be submitted at least 60 days prior to the next scheduled Executive Board Meeting.
- 6. The committee will review the application and make a recommendation to the National Executive Board, who will approve or disapprove the application. If approved, the applicant will receive a Regional Certified Judge Certificate.

Note: It is the responsibility of the applicant to keep track of the numbers of dogs that they have judged.
